PE



Music


This term in music, the unit is called 'Let's perform together!' and will involve the children learning to sing and perform a song each lesson.


History


The enquiry question for this term is 'Who lived in castles?' and the children will discover when and where the first castles were built in the United Kingdom. They will identify the typical features found in a medieval castle and what the purpose of these features could have been. They will also spend time researching the different people who would have lived in castles.











Science

The enquiry question for this term is 'Who lives there?' and the topic will give children the chance to explore different habitats around the world and how certain animals can only survive in certain places.
