Attendance and Punctuality

This week Year 4 were the highest in attendance at 99%. Whole school attendance was 88.81%

Please ensure you arrive promptly for the start of school. Learning starts at 8.50am.

95% attendance means 10 days absence and 50 lessons lost when there are 5 lessons a day. 90% attendance or less can reduce your chances of good outcomes by half. 15 minutes late every day accumulates to 3 weeks of learning lost in a school year.

Rock Steady Performance


The whole school and parents of our Rock Steady band members were treated to a performance on Monday 28th March.


Swimming
