Thank you to all the parents and carers who attended this year's sports day to encourage and cheer on the children.



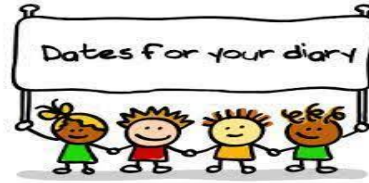
Asia (yellow team) retains the Sports Cup for a second year running. It was a close competition with only 5 points between the winners and second place.

Year 4, 5 and 6 Residential

The year 4, 5 and 6 residential visit to Hollowford Centre in Castleford is quickly approaching! There are still some outstanding payments for the residential trip. Could payments be paid as soon as possible please.



We are delighted to inform you that subject to due diligence, Billingborough Primary School will be joining the Trust this autumn. Billingborough caters for 134 Sleaford pupils. This is additionally great news for Caythorpe, as Billingborough is also a relatively small school with mixed age classes.



As part of the Trust's continuing commitment to reducing environmental impact, we are proud to report that solar panels have been installed on the roofs of twelve CIT school builds providing us with sustainable, noise free, pollution free energy. We are estimating a reduction in our carbon footprint annually by 45.34 tonnes - that is the equivalent of saving over 2,000 trees (6 acres of Forest) each year!



CIT currently employs over 750 staff and caters for over 2,500 pupils across the East Midlands. We are holding our first ever annual conference - The CIT Inclusion Fiesta - with 850 delegates attending the event this September.

This will be the first time all staff, Trustees and Local School Board members will all be together under one roof. Whether a teacher, a cook, or an administrator, we are aiming for everyone to leave the CIT Inclusion Fiesta feeling valued and able to recognise the important part everyone plays in championing CIT children.
