What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort can swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres?	91%	 11 pupils within the Year 6 cohort. 2 pupils who did not achieve 25m confidently (18%) attended further sessions with Year 3 and 4 group in the Spring Term 2024 1 pupil gained 25m with this additional input 1 pupil gained confidence in the water and achieved 25m with a woggle and 5m on back without buoyancy aids. Pupils would have had more opportunities within their yar ¾ years due National Lockdown prevented this.
