## Swimming Autumn Term



Swimming will resume on Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> September. All children are expected to be able to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of 25m and use a range of stokes effectively by the end of Year 6. This term we are focusing on pupils within Key Stage 2 who have not yet achieved this standard due to missing opportunities in younger years due to school closure during National Lockdown for Covid.

Children who are expected to go swimming in the Autumn Term will receive a letter which also asks for volunteers to accompany the children.

Children not going swimming this term will remain in school to take part in a curriculum PE session with Mr Murphy.

Swimming will cost £1.80 per session or £25.50 for the term to cover costs for transport to and from the pool for the term.
