What a busy half term we have had and in the last week it has been especially busy. You will see all the preparations we have been involved in for our Queen's Platinum Jubilee Celebrations.

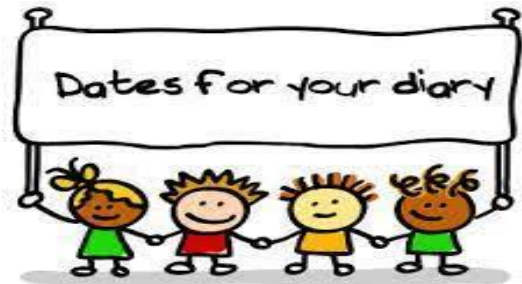

Zig Zag lines

In January I wrote to ask that parents do not park on the yellow zig zag lines at the front of the school. It has been observed by parents that some drivers are bumping up their vehicles onto the pavement and therefore blocking the pathway into school for pedestrians. We are concerned that this is endangering the lives of our children wanting to cross the road on their way to and from school. Yellow zig-zag lines indicate the length of road where stopping or waiting is strictly prohibited, even to drop off children. According to Highway Code Rule 243, you should not park near a school entrance. Ourselves or the local authority do not have the power to enforce this or issue a penalty charge notice, but the police can issue a ticket for causing an obstruction to either other traffic or pedestrians. We want to keep our children safe. Please help keep our children safe by parking considerately.

You can visit your local Urgent Treatment Centre for sprains, fractures, minor burns and skin infections. Walk in or bookable appointments available via NHS 111.

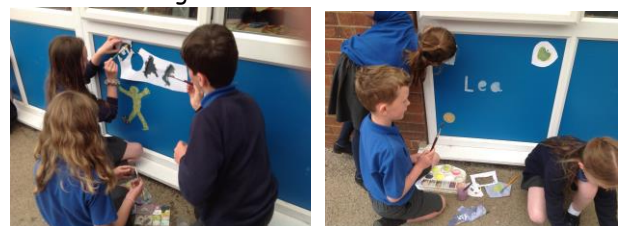

Year 5 and 6 Graffiti the school walls!

Year 5 and 6 have been learning about the artistic style of Graffiti in art this term. Graffiti, while once considered vandalism, is becoming more widely recognised as a type of artwork. The children began by using their sketch books, to develop ideas and techniques for art work comprising stylised graffiti lettering. They then developed techniques for creating street art using stencils.



To create their final artwork they selected, cut out and arranged their stencil designs making stencil street art in small groups.
