## Zig Zag lines


Yellow zig zag lines are a common feature on the roads outside schools, hospitals and police stations to name but a few. Parking on the yellow zigzag lines will block the view of the school entrance. We are concerned that this is endangering the lives of our children wanting to cross the road on their way to and from school. Did you know that Yellow zig-zag lines indicate the length of road where stopping or waiting is strictly prohibited, even to drop off children? According to Highway Code Rule 243, you should not park near a school entrance — as well as anywhere that would prevent access for emergency services. Therefore, could parents please not park in front of the emergency access gates in the carpark to the rear of school. Ourselves or the local authority have the power to enforce this or issue a penalty charge notice, but the police can issue a ticket for causing an obstruction to either other traffic or pedestrians.

We want to keep our children safe. Please help keep our children safe by parking considerately.

## What is Fitness profiling?

Carres carry out fitness profiling with Caythorpe pupils. We track events children take part in as well as clubs pupils attend and along with the fitness profiling this adds to create a broad picture of how each individual pupil keeps active and what aspect of fitness they may need to work on. This may be flexibility or ability to catch a ball. Activities children are asked to do include sit and reach (flexibility), 10m run (agility), a standing board jump, flamingo (balance) and ball catch. Height and weight are also taken however this is not an aspect we at Caythorpe focus on as useful data. If this is an aspect you do not agree with for your child, please let us know and we will ask they do not have these measurements taken as part of their profiling.




### Reading

In response to parent feedback we are now ensuring the children in KS1 and EYFS have a physical copy of a reading book suited to their phonic ability to take home as well as their e-book version.

The children will also bring home a book of their choice to share at home. This book is for enjoyment and to promote a love of reading. Parents of Year R, 1 and 2 have received a letter explaining in more detail. Books for Enchanted Forest and Neverland will be changed weekly on Fridays. Children will have shared their book in their reading groups in the week and be 95% fluent on reading this book.

We welcome all parents to record their child's reading in reading diaries. Teachers welcome an insight into what your children are enjoying reading (or not!) If your child is not enjoying their choice of reading book please encourage your child to tell their teacher. We want children to enjoy their reading.



### Topics


This term our learning is based around the following themes:

**Enchanted Forest and Neverland:** How did the fire of London start? Firstly, the children will discover where London is and when and where the fire started before moving onto the different conditions which made the fire such a feature of British history.

**Narnia:** What makes the Earth angry? Year 3 and 4 will discover the extreme weather systems and natural disasters which occur on planet Earth. Tsunamis, volcanic eruptions and hurricanes. The class's science topic of "Rocks and Soils" compliments this theme.

**Hogwarts:** Who were the Maya? This topic links with the previous topic of Brazil. The children will learn of the ancient civilization of the Mayans. In science Year 5/6 are investigating "Sound".
