Starting School



Starting school is an important milestone for both you and your child.

Our aim is to provide a relaxed and stimulating setting where children feel happy, safe and cared for.

- The first visit (4th July after school) is an opportunity for the parents and children to meet Miss Cook and have a look around the school.

First Aid

 All staff are qualified in basic first aid and able to deal with the occasional accident. As part of the requirements for the Early Years, Miss Cook and Mrs Elmes are Paediatric First Aiders along with other members of staff.



 Your child will be sent home with a letter informing you of the circumstances in which the accident occurred and what First Aid has taken place if they have a mark or a head injury.

Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum




Schools are required to follow the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum (EYFS) during the Reception year.



Monitoring Progress

The children are assessed throughout the year, through observations and on-going assessments gained during the normal day-to-day activities. As a school we use 'Tapestry' which is an online journal where all the learning and fun of children's early years education is recorded.
