Neverland Persuade Mrs Hunt to Reinstate Breaktimes!

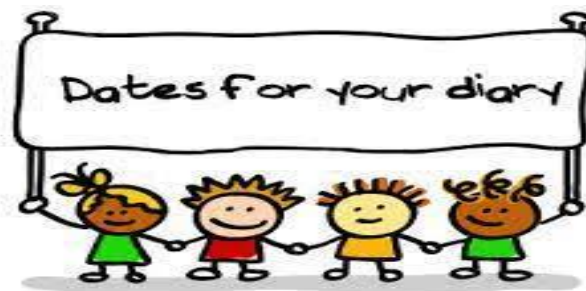
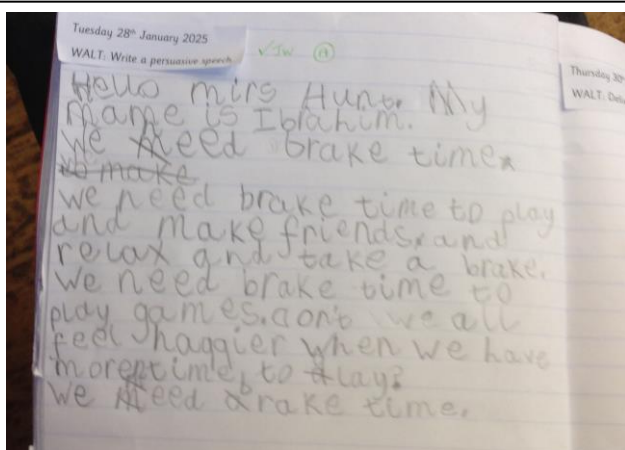
