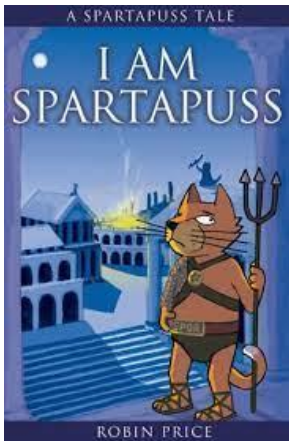


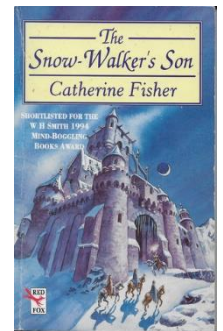
Narnia Newsletter – Term 2

Welcome to the second term of Year 3/4 – we have another exciting term ahead. During the second half of the Autumn term, the children will be looking at the topic ‘How did the Stone Age people affect our lives today?’ We will explore the science enquiry question of ‘How do our bodies function?’ The children will be learning about the skeletal muscular and digestive systems.



Our Big Bang will take place on Friday 11th November, where children will take part in a Zoom workshop with “I am Spartapuss” author Robin Price. Children will experience a fact-packed blast through the Stone age followed by an epic story writing session.

Our class book for this term is *The Snow Walker’s Son* by Catherine Fisher. We will be reading this and using it to support our learning across the term. The story follows a journey by a young girl named Jessa that will change her life forever. [A link to chapter one can be found here.](#)
